

Andinia pensilis (Schltr.) Luer, comb. nov.

Bas.: *Lepanthes pensilis* Schltr., Repert. Spec. Nov. Regni Veg. Beih. 8: 55, 1921.

Ety.: From the Latin *pensilis*, "pendent," referring to the habit.

Syn.: *Lepanthes lancipetala* L.O. Williams, Bot. Mus. Leaflet 9: 1, 1940.

Ety.: From the Latin *lancipetalus*, "with lanceolate petals," referring to entire petals, exceptional for the genus *Lepanthes*.

Syn.: *Salpistele pensilis* (Schltr.) Luer, Monogr. Syst. Bot. Missouri Bot. Garden. 39: 136, 1991.

ECUADOR: **Imbabura**: cloud forest near Lago Mojanda, west of Otavalo, alt. 3300 m, 17 Feb. 1998, C. Luer, J. Luer, A. Hirtz & J. del Hierro 18705 (MO, Neotype here designated); Mojanda, Nov. 1888, A. Sodiro S.J. 169/21bis (BR, MO). **Chimborazo**: in mountains above Riobamba, A. Mille s.n. (Holotype destroyed at B).
