## Brachionidium minusculum Luer & Dressler, sp. nov.

Ety.: From the Latin minusculus, "very small," referring to the habit of the plant.

Species haec B. pusillo Ames & Schweinf, similis, sed foliis minoribus, pedunculo breviore, synsepalo petalisque glabris et labello minore cum angulis lateralibus brevioribus falcatis differt.

Plant very small in size, epiphytic, long-repent, the rhizome slender, occasionally branching, up to 10 cm long or longer, 5-10 mm long between ramicauls, each segment with 3 shortly mucronate sheaths; roots produced singly from a node. Ramicauls suberect, 0.5 mm long, enclosed by a similar sheath. Leaf erect, thickly coriaceous, elliptical, 4-5 mm long, 2.5-3 mm wide, obtuse and minutely forked and apiculate at the apex, 5-veined, cuneate below to the base. Inflorescence a solitary, small, resupinate flower comparatively large for the plant, bome by an erect peduncle 3.5 mm long, with a bract above the base, from near the apex of the ramicaul; floral bract infundibular, acute, apiculate, 1.5 mm long, enclosing the pedicel and ovary; pedicel 0.3 mm long, with a filament 2 mm long; ovary 1 mm long; sepals translucent purple, the middle sepal sparsely short-ciliate, ovate, acute, acuminate, caudate, 7 mm long including the filiform tail 4 mm long, 1.5 mm wide, 3-veined, the lateral sepals glabrous, completely connate into a narrowly triangular, acute, acuminate, caudate synsepal, 6 mm long including the tail, 1 mm wide, 2-veined; petals translucent purple, glabrous, ovate, slightly oblique, acute, acuminate, caudate, 6.5 mm long including the filiform tail, 1 mm wide, 1(3)-veined; lip transversely trapeziform, 0.5 mm long, 1 mm wide, the lateral angles falcate, acute, the apex rounded, concave, apiculate, the disc with an ovoid, minutely pubescent callus; column stout, 0.5 mm long, bidentate, pollinia presumably 6.

COSTA RICA: Prov. of Cartago: Tapantí, alt. m, R. L. Dressler & Dora Mora de Retana s.n. (Holotype: CR; Isotype: MO), C. Luer illustr. 17244.

This tiny, long-repent species is known only from one collection by Dressler. Vegetatively it appears similar to B. pusillum, except that the leaves are considerably smaller. The flowers of the two species are very similar in size and shape. The flower of the one specimen of B. minusculum is purple, while the flowers of B. pusillum are usually yellow. The dorsal



sepal of B. minusculum is microscopically sparsely ciliate while the synsepal and petals are glabrous; the sepals and petals of B. pusillum are shortly ciliate. The lateral angles of the tiny, one-millimeter-wide lip are falcate. The lip of B. pusillum is three times wider with large, acute, triangular, lateral lobes.

## Brachionidium muscosum Luer & Vásquez, Phytologia 55: 177, 1984.

Ety.: From the Latin muscosus, "mossy," in reference to the habitat and appearance of the plant.

Plant small, epiphytic in loose moss, long-repent, the rhizome slender, occasionally branching, up to 10 cm long, 2-5 mm long between ramicauls, each enclosed by 3 imbricating sheaths with narrowly mucronate apices; roots comparatively thick, from nodes on the rhizome. Ramicauls suberect, 1.5-2 mm long, enclosed by 2 narrowly mucronate sheaths. Leaf suberect, coriaceous, 8-10 mm long including the 1 mm long petiole, the blade elliptical, acute, apiculate, 3-4.5 mm wide, 3-veined, the base cuneate. Inflorescence a solitary, non-resupinate, translucent white flower borne by an erect, slender peduncle 12-14 mm long, with a bract below the middle and at the base, from near the apex of the ramicaul; floral bract infundibular, mucronate, 1.5 mm long; pedicel 0.5 mm long, with a filament 2 mm long; ovary 1 mm long; sepals ciliate, the middle sepal ovate, acute, acuminate, long-caudate, 10 mm long including the tail 6.5 mm long, 1.75 mm wide, 3-veined, the lateral sepals completely connate into an ovate, acute, acuminate, long-caudate synsepal, 10.5 mm long including the tail 7.5 mm long, 1.8 mm wide, 2-veined; petals minutely fimbriate, ovate, oblique, acute, acuminate, long-caudate, 7 mm long including the tail 4 mm long, 1.25 mm wide, 1-veined; lip thick, transversely cordate, lightly concave, 1.25 mm long, 1.75 mm wide expanded, the lateral angles obtuse to rounded, the apex obtuse, minutely apiculate, the disc with a low, flat, triangular, minutely pubescent callus; column stout, 0.5 mm long, with 6 pollinia.




Plate 36. Brachionidium minusculum Luer & Dressler
