1. C. disoides; sepalis inferioribus porrectis apice emarginatis attenuatis, labello unguiculato cristato: lobis lateralibus cucullatis membranaceis nudis, intermedio carnoso glanduloso.

Spontè crescit circà Valparaiso: Februario florentem legit McRae, (v. s. sp.) Leaves erect, acute, sheathing, as long as the somewhat leafy scape, which rises to the height of six or eight inches. Squamæ of the scape membranous, inflated, acute. Flower ringent. Sepals membranous, veiny, the three upper conniving, erect, lanceolate, somewhat obtuse; the two lower spreading with a tapering, fleshy, channelled, obtuse end. Labellum stalked, cordate, cucullate, three-lobed, continuous with the base of the columna; the two lateral lobes shorter than the middle one, membranous, veiny, with the anterior margin crenated and callous; the middle lobe ovate, abruptly acuminate, obtuse, fleshy, crested in the middle with numerous fleshy appendages; the disk with seven rows of interrupted excrescences, the lateral rows being shorter than the rest. Columna erect, long, linear, with a membranous margin.
