## New Plants.

### — EPIDENDRUM CALIGARIUM, n. sp.

Amphiglottium inflorescentiæ ramis approximatis  
secundifloris; ovariis bene cuniculatis longe pediculis  
sepalis petalisque oblongo-triangulis, labelli laciniis  
libus tri-quadripartitis, partitionibus linearibus apice  
denticulatis, lacinia media obovato emarginata  
callo depresso ligulato apice bidentato flavo in  
columna ampla apice quadriloba, lobis integris.

Very near *Epidendrum myrianthum*, but  
different, in the pitted ovary and the callosities  
the base of the lip, much like a boot—hence the name.  
It is Centro-American. We have to thank  
Mr. Wentworth W. Buller, who informs us that  
growth is dwarfer than that of old *E. myrianthum*.
