- EPIDENDRUM CALIGARIUM, n. sp.

Amphiglottium inflorescentiae ramis approximatis
secundifloris; ovaris bene cuniculatis longe pedunculatis;
sepalis petalisque oblongo-triangulis, labelli lacinia
libus tri-quadripartitis, partitionibus linearibus apice
denticulatis, lacinia media obovato emarginata dentata,
callo depresso ligulato apice bidentato flavo
columna ampla apice quadriloba, lobis integris.

Very near *Epidendrum myrianthum*, but
different, in the pitted ovary and the callus
the base of the lip, much like a boot—hence the name.
It is Centro-American. We have to thank
Mr. Wentworth W. Buller, who informs us that
growth is dwarfer than that of old *E. myrianthum*.
