
New Garden Plants.

ZYGOPETALUM (KEFERSTEINIA) LACTEUM, *n. sp.*

Foliis valde pergameneis cuneato oblongis acutis ; pedunculis unifloris ; bracteis triangulis parvis ; sepalis tepalisque oblongis acutis ; labello latissime cuneato oblongo retuso hinc crenulato ; callo depresso apice bifido laciniis triangulis in basi ; columna medio dilatata, nunc angulata.

A plant in the way of *Zygopetalum* (*Kefersteinia*) *sanguinolentum*, with exceedingly stout leaves. Flowers small, white, with a few brownish dots and streaks at the base. It was originally discovered by Mr. Wallis during his adventurous expedition to Chiriqui. Later, it was collected by M. Endres. It flowered some years ago with Director Linden, and is now once more in flower with Messrs. Veitch. *H. G. Rehb. f.*
