

Lepanthes anemica Lucr & Thoerle, sp. nov. TYPE: COLOMBIA. Antioquia: Cocomá, Río Vino, collected March 1999, by Francisco López, flowered in cultivation by Colomborquideas, Retiro, 15 June 2009, L. Thoerle 142 (Holotype: MO), C. Lucr Illustr. 21485. Fig. 20.

Species haec Lepanthis agglutinatae Lvet affinis, sed sepalis proportione angustioribus, petalis albis laete roseomarginatis, labelli laminis liberis, appendice minore, et columnae apice latissimi differt.

Plant medium in size, epiphytic, caespitose; roots and thisome unknown. Ramicauds steder, erect, at least 75 cm long, enclosed by at least 8 microscopically citiate. Jepanthiform sheaths. Leaf erect, thinly coriaccous, ovate, caute, acuminate, 55 cm long, 3 cm wide, the base broadly cuneate to rounded, contracted into a petiole 2-4 mm long. Inflorescence an extremely congested, long-pedicilates, successively numming.

flowered raceme up to 15 mm long, borne by a slender peduncle 5-22 mm long, along the back of the leaf; floral bracts 1-1.5 mm long; pedicels 2-3 mm long; ovary 2 mm long; sepals translucent light vellow, carinate, with microscopically denticulate margins, acute, acuminate, the dorsal senal ovate-triangular, 7.5 mm long, 4.25 mm wide, 3-veined, connate to the lateral sepals for 1.5 mm, the lateral sepals ovate, oblique, acute, acuminate, 8.5 mm long, 2.5 mm wide, 2-veined, connate 2 mm; petals white with the upper and inner margins pale rose, shortly pubescent, transversely bilobed. 1.25 mm long, 4.5 mm wide, 3-veined, with a 0.5 mm long process from the outer margin at the midvein, the upper lobe oblong, obliquely obtuse, 2.4 mm long, the lower lobe triangular, obtuse, 1.8 mm long; lip rose, bilaminate, the blades thin, free, microscopically pubescent, oblong-ovate with rounded ends, 1.2 mm long, the connectives narrow, oblique, from the central portion of the blade, the body broad with the basal halves of the connectives, connate to the base of the column, the sinus bitumerous, the appendix pubescent, triangular, narrowly truncate, concave basally, 0.4 mm long; column stout, 1.7 mm long, the apex 1 mm wide, the anther apical, the stigma ventral.

Etymology: From the Greek anhaemeticos, "anemic," referring to the pale colors of the flower.

This species from the Central Cordillera of Colombia is similar to the frequent and widely distributed Lepanthes agglutinata Luer, and possibly has been identified as that. In habit similar, it is distinguished from L. agglutinata by larger flowers with narrower, longersouminate sepais. The petals of the two species are similar except that those of L. agglutinatas are green with upper pottin dark purple. In the present specimen, the blades of the lip are not "agglutinated."
