## Lepanthes elytrifera Luer & Jost, sp. nov.

Ety.: From the Latin elytra and -fer, "bearing a pair of horny covers like the wings of beetles."

Planta grandis, racemo disticho congesto folio elliptico abrupte brevi-acuminato breviore, sepalis ovatis acuminatis liberis, petalis transverse lobatis glabris, labelli laminis oblongis convexis membranaceis, connectivis crassis, appendice bifurcata distinguitur.

Plant large, epiphytic, caespitose; roots slender. Ramicauls stout, erect, 13-20 cm long, enclosed by 12-14 acuminate, glabrous, lepanthiform sheaths with thickened margins. Leaf erect, elliptical, shortly acuminate, 6-8 cm long, 3-4 cm wide, the base rounded, abruptly contracted into a petiole 6-7 mm long. Inflorescence a distictious, congested, successively many-flowered raceme, up to 15 mm long, borne behind the leaf by a slender peduncle 25-30 mm long; floral bracts acuminate, 2-2.5 mm long; pedicels 1.5-2 mm long; ovary 8 mm long; sepals free, diverging, pale yellow, microscopically ciliate, sharply carinate, concave centrally, ovate, acute, acuminate, the dorsal sepal 9 mm long, 4 mm wide, 3-veined, the lateral sepals oblique, 9 mm long, 2 mm wide, 2-veined; petals yellow, red at the base, connate to the column above the base, glabrous, transversely blobed, 0.75 mm long, 2 mm wide, the upper lobe obliquely oblong, obtuse, the lower lobes triangular; lip purple, bilaminate, the blades glabrous, oblong, with obtuse ends, notched medially below the apex, ciliate apically, 2 mm long, convex with the lateral halves membranous, the connectives broadly cuneate, thick, forming a stout body, connate to the base of the column, the appendix small, bifid above the base; column 1.5 mm long, the anther and stigma apical.

ECUADOR: Tungurahua: mountains above Ulba, alt. 2550 m, 23 Mar. 1999, L. Jost 1490 (Holotype: MO), C. Luer illustr. 19156.

This large species of series Lepanthes subsection Lepanthes is superficially similar to L. condorensis Luer & Hirtz, with diverging sepals, but the sepals of L. elytrifera are free. The blades of the lip are oblong with the outer halves membranous, and thickened medially with the connectives. The appendix is forked above the middle.




Fig. 296. Lepanthes elytrifera
