ONCIDIUM CHRYSOPS, *n. sp.**

MR. HUGH Low kindly informs me that this *Oncidium* struck him by its difference from its companions. It has short reddish leaves. The reddish racemose peduncle offers flowers which are distinct from those of the three neighbouring species—*bicallosum*, *Cavendishianum*, and *pachyphyllum*. The cuneate-oblong sepals and the much broader somewhat wavy blunt petals are of a very light brown colour. The basilar laciniae of the bright yellow lip are as small as in *Oncidium bicallosum*, the isthmus is very short, and the large anterior blade is reniform emarginate. The calli are triseriate. There are two large pistillar calli at the base, three filiform acute very small calli in the middle, and three larger terete acute calli in front. The column has falcate deflexed wings, with a tooth in front before they bend down on the superior margin. *H. G. Rehb. f.*
