New Garden Plants.

MORMODES FRACTIFLEXUM, n. sp.

Racemo paucifloro laxifloro fractiflexo; sepalis tepalisque ligulatis acutis; labello unguiculato spatulato valde dilatato flabellato rotundato cum apiculo; foveolo superne biloba in disco, omnino glabro.

The sepals and petals are of a whitish green, with purplish streaks and some such dots; the lip white, with radiating purplish streaks on the under side, and some such dots on the over side of the axil. Column distinctly purplish. It would be M. buccinator if only it had a strict and compact raceme. The lip is generally bent in two unequal sides, yet that may be monstrous since the best first developed flower is different, showing two great symmetrical valves. Imported from Costa Rica by Messrs.
