
New Plants.

MORMODES SKINNERI, sp. n.

Sepalis petalisque lineariligulatis acutis deflexis, labellum unguiculato dein dilatato transverse rotundulo villis (velutino), fovea impressa in linea media, antice medio-dentato, dentibus lateralibus obtusangulis abbreviatis, dente medio triangulo longiori reflexo.

When we first obtained this plant we believed it to be *Mormodes barbatum*, Lindl., but that has a transverse lamina to the lip, covered with dense velvet, without the three apical teeth. Our species is a little prettier. The sepals and petals are honey-coloured, with five longitudinal bars of blotches and lines of a deep blood colour. The lip is deep yellow, with red spots and white hairs. The column is whitish.

Messrs. Veitch obtained the plant through the late G. Ure Skinner, Esq., from Central America. We have dedicated it to the memory of that gentleman, whose death was a severe loss for Orchidology. *H. G. Rehb. M.*
