1. C. viridis (Maxillaria viridis, Lindl. in Bot. Reg. t. 1510.); sepalis petalisque conniventibus oblongo-subrotundis obtusis subæqualibus, labelli brevis trilobi lobo medio transversè rhomboideo unguiculato plano.-----Brazil.—Flowers green, with a dingy violet lip. That it differs from C. placanthera, in the manner stated under that species, I know from having preserved the specimen from which the figure in the Botanical Register was taken; which figure well represents the peculiar rounded form of the sepals. I believe it is no longer in our gardens; for C. pla-

canthera is usually cultivated under its name.
