


**7. PLEUROTHALLIS COTYLIGERA** Luer & R. Escobar, sp. nov.

Inter species subsectionis *Macrophyllae-Racemosae* folio elliptico leviter acuminato petiolato, racemo pendulo paucifloro, synsepalo profunde concavo, petalis ovatis acutis, labello trilobato, lobo antico integro acuto, lobis lateribus obtusis erectis columnam amplexentibus, disci callo cymbiformi distinguitur.

**TYPE:** Colombia: Dept. of Risaralda: without specific locality (probably near Pereira), flowered in cultivation by S. Tsubota, 10 May 1993, C. Luer 16765 (Holotype: MO).



**PLEUROTHALLIS COTYLIGERA** Luer & R. Escobar

**ETIMOLOGIA:** Del latín *cotyliger*, "que lleva una copa", en referencia al callo del labelo.

**ETYMOLOGY:** From the Latin *cotyliger*, "bearing a cup," referring to the labellar callus.

**Plant** medium in size to large, epiphytic, caespitose; roots slender. Ramicauls slender, erect, 13-22 cm long, with a tubular sheath below the middle and 2-3 others at the base. **Leaf** erect, coriaceous, elliptical, petiolate, acute, lightly acuminate, 12-16 cm long including the petiole ca. 2 cm long, 3.5-4.5 cm wide, cuneate below into the petiole. **Inflorescence** a pendent, few-flowered raceme, ca. 2 cm long, produced from an ovoid spathe 0.5 cm long at the apex of the ramicaul; peduncle arcuate, 1 cm long; floral bracts infundibular, 4 mm long; pedicels 5 mm long; ovary curved, 3 mm long; **sepals** translucent yellow-green, glabrous, the middle sepal ovate, acute, 8 mm long, 4.25 mm wide, 3-veined, the lateral sepals completely connate into a deeply concave, cymbiform, obtuse synsepal, 8 mm long, 6.5 mm wide unexpanded, 6-veined; **petals** green, thick, glabrous, ovate, acute, 7.5 mm long, 2.5 mm wide, 3-veined; **lip** thick, trilobed, 1.5 mm long from base to apex, 3 mm wide unexpanded, with the apical lobe triangular, acute, the basal lobes erect, obtuse, thickened within the margins, flanking the column, the disc with a central, circular depression surrounded by thickened margins, the base shortly and broadly reflexed, connected to the obsolescent column-foot; **column** stout, terete, 2 mm long, the foot obsolescent, the anther, rostellum and stigma apical.

Esta especie, la que se conoce sólamente de una colecta en la Cordillera Central de Colombia, está emparentada con *P. strobilifera*, pero se distingue por las hojas pecioladas, las flores más pequeñas de color verde-amarillento; y un labelo con un callo deprimido, marginado y circular en el centro.

This species, known only from a collection from the Central Cordillera of Colombia, is related to *P. strobilifera*, but it is distinguished by the petiolate leaves; smaller, yellow-green flowers; and a lip with a circular, callous-margined depression in the center.
