SOBRALIA SUAVEOLENS, n. sp. †

This curious novelty may be compared to Sobralia Bletiæ, Rchb. f. It has the habit of Sobralia decora. Bat., and nice ochroleucous flowers with a wonderful perfume. The lip is white, the keels yellow, brown on the disk of the anterior lacinia of lip. These colours make one think of such Ceelogynes as C. lentiginosa. It was introduced from Colon (Aspinwall) in Central America by Mr. Stanger (once the Orchid grower of late Consul Schiller, now possessor of a good nursery, and member of the directorial committee of our Gartenbau Gesellschaft), who presented it to the Botanic Garden, where it flowered in March under M.
