PLEUROTHĀLLĪS *pachyglōssā*; folio ovato-lanceolato apice tridentato caule suo longiore scapo breviorē, scapo filiformi erecto distanter 4-floro, sepalis lineari-lanceolatis acuminatis membranaceis inferiore bicarinato bidentato, petalis carnosis obovatis convexis trinerviis apice rotundatis dorso sub apice verrucosis, labello petalis duplō longiore unguiculato crassissimo obtuso linguiformi basi auriculis duabus membranaceis aucto medio villosō dorso verrucosō.

This is the largest flowered species I have yet seen in the genus. It has purple semitransparent sepals six lines long, and about four flowers on a slender scape, divided from each other by intervals of nearly an inch. It stands next *P. fusca* and *ephemera*. Mr. Barker imported it from Mexico.
