PLEUROTHALLIS *pachyglossa*; folio ovato-lanceolato apice tridentato caule suo longiore scapo breviore, scapo filiformi erecto distanter 4-floro, sepalis linear-lanceolatis acuminatis membranaceis inferiore bicarinato bidentato, petalis carnosis obovatis convexis trinerviis apice rotundatis dorso sub apice verrucosis, labello petalis duplò longiore unguiculato crassissimo obtuso linguiformi basi auriculis duabus membranaceis aucto medio viloso dorso verrucoso.

This is the largest flowered species I have yet seen in the genus. It has purple semitransparent sepals six lines long, and about four flowers on a slender scape, divided from each other by intervals of nearly an inch. It stands next *P. fusca* and *ephemera*. Mr. Barker imported it from Mexico.
