## STENIA GUTTATA, n. sp. ‡

Take the well-known rare Stenia pallida, give it shorter rather blunt sepals and petals, with spots of indian-purple on a straw-coloured ground, let the lip have such blotches too and only seven callous teeth, then change the linear pollinia to pyriform ones, and you have the very unexpected novelty which was gethered a while ago in Peru by Mr. Davis. It is just now in flower with Messrs. Veitch. *H. G. Rchb. f.*
