Ety.: Named in honor of G.C.K. (Stalky) Dunsterville, noted author and illustrator of the orchids of Venezuela, who first illustrated this species.

Species haec T. vaganti (Garay & Dunst.) Luer similis, sed floribus majoribus cum mento grandi, labello arcuato tricalloso cum lobis basalibus differt.

Plant small to medium in size, epiphytic, prolific, branching, erect to suberect, up to 15 cm or more tall; roots slender at the base. Ramicauls ascending, slender, producing another ramical from the apex, 1-2 cm long above, up to 6 cm long below, enclosed by 2-4 lepanthiform sheaths with minutely scabrous ostia. Leaf erect, thickly coriaceous, semiterete, narrowly elliptical, acute, 2-4 cm long, 2.5-3 mm wide, 2-2.5 mm thick, contracted below into a petiole 1-2 mm long. Inflorescence a loose, simultaneously few-flowered raceme 4-5 cm long including the filiform peduncle 1-1.5 cm long, from near the apex of a ramicaul; floral bracts 1.5-2 mm long; pedicels 2-4 mm long; ovary 0.8 mm long; sepals yellow, glabrous, subcarinate, the dorsal sepal narrowly ovate, concave, acute, long-attenuate, 12-14 mm long, 2 mm wide, 3-veined, barely connate to the lateral sepals, the lateral sepals narrowly linear-triangular, oblique, acute, 12-13 mm long, 1 mm wide, 1-veined; petals translucent, elliptical, subacute, 2.3 long, 0.8 mm wide, 1-veined; lip yellow, elliptical-trilobed, arcuate, 3.2 mm long, 1.4 mm wide, the apex broadly rounded, the lateral lobes small, above the base, erect, oblique, obtuse, antrorse, the disc with a pair of tall carinae in the middle third from the lateral lobes, the sides deflexed from the basal lobes, with a thickened midvein down the center for two thirds the length, the base truncate, hinged to the columnfoot; column terete, 1.5 mm long, with small, obtuse, apical wings, the foot 1 mm long, the anther apical, the stigma ventral.

VENEZUELA: Edo. Trujillo: epiphytic in cloud forest between Boconó and Guaramacal, alt. 2350 m, Jan. 1970, collector unknown, illustrated by G. C. K. Dunsterville 1127 (Holotype: AMES), C. Luer illustr. 17187.

*Trichosalpinx dunstervillei* is known only from the type-collection from the Sierra Nevada de Venezuela. The accompanying description and illustration were made from alcoholized material at AMES. Dunsterville's illustration (*Dunsterville 1127*) was used to illustrate *T. vagans*.

Trichosalpinx dunstervillei differs from the Colombian T. vagans by the larger flowers, an acute mentum not seen in Dunsterville's illustration, and a larger, arcuate lip. The lateral lobes are above the base with the sides of the lip deflexed from them. Instead of a tall, central carina, the midvein is thickened into a low carina between the pair of tall, parallel carinae.




Fig. 43. Trichosalpinx dunstervillei
