## Trichosalpinx parsonsii Luer & Dod, sp. nov.

Ety.: Named in honor of Jerry Parsons of Berkeley, CA, co-collector of this species.

Species haec T. durae (Lindl.) Luer affinis, sed floribus minoribus, sepalis angustioribus et labello oblongo ecalloso distinguitur.

Plant small, epiphytic, scandent, prolific, up to 10 cm or more long; roots slender along the stem. Ramicauls ascending, slender, producing another ramical from the apex, 10-12 mm long, enclosed by 3-4 minutely ciliate, lepanthiform sheaths. Leaf ascending, thickly coriaceous, elliptical, obtuse, 8-10 mm long, 4.5-6 mm wide, broadly cuneate or rounded below into a petiole ca. 1 mm long. Inflorescence a loose, subflexuous, distichous, simultaneously few-flowered raceme 2-3 cm long including the filiform peduncle ca. 1 cm long, from near the apex of a ramicaul; floral bracts 1 mm long; pedicels 2 mm long; ovary 0.5 mm long; sepals pale yellow, glabrous, subcarinate, the dorsal sepal narrowly ovate-triangular and concave below the middle, acute, attenuate above the middle, 4 mm long, 1 mm wide, 3-veined, barely connate to the lateral sepals, the lateral sepals free, narrowly triangular, attenuate, acute, oblique, 4 mm long, 0.75 mm wide, 1-veined; petals membranous, elliptical, oblique, obtuse, microscopically irregular at the tip, 1.5 mm long, 0.8 mm wide, 1-veined; lip yellowish, oblong, very shallowly concave, 1.5 mm long, 0.5 mm wide, with the apex rounded and thickened, the base truncate, hinged to the column-foot; column terete, 0.6 mm long, wingless, the foot minute, 0.2 mm long, the anther subapical, the stigma ventral.

COSTA RICA: Prov. of San José: near Santa Maria de Dota, 13 June 1990, flowered in cultivation in Berkeley, CA, by D. Dod, June, 1997, M. Grantham & J. Parsons 03 93 90 (Holotype: UC; Isotype: MO), C. Luer illustr. 18486.

This little species with small prolific ramicauls and small elliptical leaves is vegetatively similar to sympatric forms of the *T. dura*-complex and the Andean *T. scabridula*. Loose racemes of tiny, yellow flowers exceed the leaves. From both the above, *T. parsonsii* differs with the smaller flowers with proportionately narrower sepals and a simple, oblong lip free of any callus.
